SPIRITUAL MESSAGE



Brothers and Sisters in Christ the Gospels tell us how literally thousands would gather to listen to Christ preach, spellbound by His every word.

There is a great difference, however, in listening and obeying. Many who heard our Savior's teaching found them too challenging and too difficult to accept. The standards He set for His followers went far beyond the moral and spiritual code anyone else had ever offered.

The Orthodox Christian of today also finds it difficult to obey the teachings of Jesus Christ. How can we love our enemies? How can we do good to those who wrong us? How can we give up everything we have in a world where one's possessions define his or her importance and social stature? When confronted with such disturbing questions, we, too are tempted to walk away and abandon the Master, feeling that it is impossible to walk in His footsteps. With God, however, all things are possible. He does not ask us to do anything that is beyond our human abilities and capabilities. When Christ came into the world, He did so as a Man, facing the same temptations and struggles that we all encounter. **He proved that mankind could follow God's laws and live according to His teachings.**

Others have chosen to commend their entire life to Christ. **Will we join them, making a total commitment to Him like the saints of old?** The choice, indeed, is ours to make.

"Come and follow Me" (John 1:43). It means, "Come and live like Me" Our Lord extended this to Philip in the Gospel Lesson, but in truth it is extended to every Christian of every age.
