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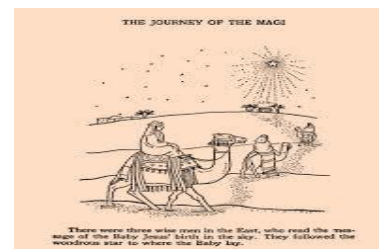

This is why it is said, “Awake, O sleeper, rise up from the dead, and Christ will give you light.”

Living by the Spirit’s Power ¹⁵So be careful how you live. Don’t live like fools, but like those who are wise. ¹⁶Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. ¹⁷Don’t act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do. ¹⁸Don’t be drunk with wine, because that will ruin your life. Instead, be filled with the Holy Spirit, ¹⁹singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, and making music to the Lord in your hearts.

TODAY - Our regular schedule of services. During the Liturgy we ask the Lord to bless our sick friends and relatives. May they receive the healing power of Jesus Christ through the care and concern of those around them.

NATIVITY FAST: Please remember that a period of abstinence and penance is practiced by the Eastern Orthodox, and Eastern Catholic Churches, in preparation for the Nativity of Christ, (January 7). The fast is observed from November 28 to January 6 inclusive. The Nativity Fast serves to renew our spiritual unity with God and to prepare us for the Feast of the Nativity of Christ. Orthodox theology sees a synthesis between the body and the soul, so what happens to one affects the other. The church teaches that it is not enough to fast from food; one must also fast from anger, greed and covetousness. In addition to fasting, almsgiving is also emphasized.

PLEASE REMEMBER DURING THIS HARD TIME TO PRAY FOR our brothers and sisters who are in hospital, care homes, nursing facilities, shut-ins or at home: **LORD OUR GOD, HEAL** our ills, forgive our sins and help us to realize your goodness toward us. Crown us with your love and compassion so that we may live our lives for you.

THE FRUITS OF TRUE PRAYER: Prayer is doxology, praise, thanksgiving, confession, supplication and intercession to God.
