God's Promises Bring Hope

Then you will not become spiritually dull and indifferent. Instead, you will follow the example of those who are going to inherit God's promises because of their faith and endurance. For when God made a promise to Abraham, because He could swear by no one greater, He swore by Himself, saying, "Surely blessing

I will bless you, and multiplying I will multiply you." And so, after he had patiently endured, he obtained the promise. For men indeed swear by the greater, and an oath for confirmation is for them an end of all dispute. Thus God, determining to show more abundantly to the heirs of promise the immutability of His counsel, confirmed it by an oath, that by two immutable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we might have strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold of the hope set before us. This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which enters the Presence behind the veil, where the forerunner has entered for us, even Jesus, having become High Priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek. PASTORAL MESSAGE

FORGIVENESS OF SIN...

Forgiveness

Few topics are less popular these days than sin. The concept of sin, and of a person's responsibility for it, has been vanishing in our society. A

noted physician, in fact, wrote a book some years back entitled, "Whatever Became of Sin?" But during the Great Fast, as Christians prepare for the Day of Resurrection, they think of sin and of absolution as they receive the sacrament-mystery of Penance, Confession. How did Our Lord regard sin? Jesus dealt gently with sinners, but severely with sin. To those who were sorry, repentant, He offered full pardon, forgiveness, with an admonition to forsake sin. To the paralyzed man brought to Him, Jesus said: "My son, your sins are forgiven you." After healing the blind man, Jesus said, "Sin no more, lest something worse comes to you." Christ instructed His apostles to deal with sins. "Whosoever sins you forgive, they are forgiven; and whosoever sins you retain, they are retained," He said. The Early Church did the same, and the present Church likewise provides for the forgiveness of sins in Penance. The sacrament has been called the "second baptism," for it washes away transgressions committed after one's rebirth in Christ. It restores one to fellowship with the Saviour, and heals the wounds of the spirit.
