VARANYKY MAKING AND SALES (January 2nd and 3rd):

The SAS Committee would like to acknowledge and congratulate the volunteers from last weekend. It was the first time that this new team of volunteers made varenyky. On Saturday morning volunteers diligently cleaned the kitchen and kitchen equipment. They worked hard and well into the late afternoon. Many of them stayed a little later to finish up

the pinching and with clean up. Volunteers produced 9 bins or 2700+ (approximately) varenyky. The SAS committee appreciated the volunteers' patience and understanding as this was a new venture during COVID-19. Volunteers were great at abiding by SAS safety protocols. Volunteers were all consciousness about signing in, wearing masks, washing hands and maintained a safe distance from one another. On Sunday afternoon we sold over 175 dozen varenyky in 3 hours and brought in approximately \$1000. This was a record setting afternoon sales day for the church. Of course, money was not our primary focus. The focus was the safety of the volunteers, provide traditional Ukrainian food for our loyal patrons and to bring in a little revenue for the church. Once again tremendous job and thank you for your time and effort! This wouldn't have happened or have been such a success without all of you.
